Tool	Description
<u>SCDHEC Food Desert Map</u>	<p>The SC Food Desert Map was created by SC DHEC with data from the USDA Economic Research Atlas 2019 to help partner agencies identify low-income areas with poor access to healthy foods (supermarkets or grocery stores), aka “food deserts”.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Orange shaded areas indicate the low-income, poor food access areas • Resource also includes listing of mobile markets by county (select the mobile market icon in the legend – Truck with carrot) <p>Strategies: identification of target areas for home-delivered or congregate meal services, grocery bag programs, partnerships with entities such as: FoodShareSC (or similar entity), mobile markets or food pantries, etc.</p>
<u>Clemson + SCDHEC Food Access Map</u>	<p>The Clemson + SCDHEC Food Access Map identifies food resources across the state. Filtering options include: senior oriented resources, organizations that accept SNAP, etc.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Examples of resources: Congregate meal sites, Food pantries, and office locations for DSS, DHEC, and United Way.
<u>SCDHEC Farmers' Markets and Roadside Markets Map</u>	<p>The SCDHEC Farmers’ Markets and Roadside Markets Map was created to showcase and promote markets where the community can purchase fresh fruits and vegetables. Information can be filtered by county. Payment methods for produce is also included (i.e. accepts SNAP).</p>
