About the VAGAL SC Vulnerable Adult Fund

The VAGAL SC Vulnerable Adult Fund (VAGAL Fund) was established in early 2021, for the purpose of creating a means of providing necessary items and time limited services in order to ensure the wellbeing and dignity of vulnerable adults served by the VAGAL SC Program.

The Need

Persons placed into emergency protective custody are taken from their home abruptly due to abuse, neglect, self-neglect, or exploitation. They often do not have the opportunity or capability to gather their personal items and it may be unsafe to re-enter their home. Many of these vulnerable adults have little or no assets and no family members or friends who can or will provide support.

Items Provided

Toiletries and clothing; reading glasses; communication tools i.e., tablets, notepads, or stamps; mind challenging items i.e., various reading books or activity books; comfort items i.e., a doll or a blanket; and snacks or treats.
